#### **Summary of Results**


- **Hotel room occupancy** for June 2025 was 83%, on par with June 2024. Year to date occupancy for 2025 was 75%, on par with the same period for 2024. Occupancy excluding London was 79% for June 2025, 1% lower than last year.
- Observing **forward looking occupancy** for the following 3 months of 2025. As of the 9th July, occupancy rates committed so far for July 2025 were 65%, followed by 30% for August and 17% for September. These rates will rise as the months progress and more bookings are made.
- Average Daily Rates decreased 5% in June 2025 to £181, with RevPAR (Revenue per Available Room) also showing a decline (-4% to £150). ADR excluding London was £109 (-1%), and RevPAR was £86 (+3%).
- Room demand declined in June 2025, though less sharply than in February, which remains the month with the steepest drop in demand so far this year. Compared to June 2024, demand 2.9% lower. Supply was similar, at -3% compared to June 2024.
- **Regionally,** the South West recorded the largest increase in occupancy compared to June 2024, rising by 3%. In contrast, the North East and North West saw the steepest declines, with occupancy falling by 3% each. The West Midlands reported the strongest growth in both ADR (+2%) and RevPAR (+3%), while Greater London experienced the sharpest decline in ADR and the North West recorded the biggest drop in RevPAR (-7%).
- The **larger hotels** had the highest room occupancy in June, at 87% occupation for hotels 300+ rooms, on par with June 2024.



#### 2024 Occupancy rates and forward look for 2025



# Methodology



#### **Methodology Statement**

In May 2024, a change of suppliers was made to the hotel occupancy data. The data in this report is now provided by Amadeus, a hotel market data company, from their constantly growing panel of hotels across the UK.

This data set represents approximately a third of the estimated market so should be used as an indication of trends rather than the picture of the whole market.

Amadeus collects the following performance metrics from participating hotel on a daily basis through their online platform or data feeds:

- Number of rooms available
- Number of rooms sold
- Total room revenue

These baseline figures are used to calculate the three most relevant metrics within the accommodation industry namely: Occupancy, Average Daily Rate (ADR) and Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR). All units given throughout this report represent a positive number, unless stated otherwise.

To allow a meaningful comparison of year-on-year trends, VisitEngland has included historical data from Amadeus in this reports from January 2019 onwards.
