Conferences and business events are more than gatherings – they are engines of **knowledge exchange, innovation, and collaboration that drive economic growth**. In the UK alone, the business events industry contributes £46.95 billion to the economy each year, accounting for more than half of that value of all events in the country¹. This reflects not only the scale of the sector, but also its growing influence in connecting people, industries and ideas on a global stage.

Increasingly, the success of a conference is shaped by its alignment with the expertise of the host destination. Research shows that **more than 80% of meetings now reflect a city or region's specialist sectors²**, highlighting a clear trend towards a sector-first approach when assessing the suitability of destinations. This alignment creates powerful opportunities: delegates gain deeper engagement, local stakeholders forge new partnerships, and industries accelerate collaboration that drives long-term progress.

England is uniquely placed to deliver this kind of **knowledge-driven impact**. Our country is home to world-renowned universities, research institutes, innovation hubs and thriving industry clusters. In Cambridge, global leaders in life sciences and biotechnology are shaping the future of healthcare. Manchester is pioneering advanced materials and digital innovation, while Liverpool continues to lead in health sciences, maritime innovation and creative research. Sheffield is driving excellence in advanced manufacturing and sustainable engineering, and Leeds is strengthening its position in healthcare innovation and data analytics. Bristol and the Midlands are hubs of aerospace and automotive engineering, while Nottingham is making strides in medical technology and sustainable design. Newcastle is advancing clean energy solutions, Brighton is fostering creativity and digital innovation along the South Coast, and London - with its financial services, tech sector and creative industries - continues to set the pace on a global stage.

For organisers, this means access to a **rich network of thought leaders and innovators** who can contribute to conference programmes, develop partnerships, and deliver mutual value to associations and host destinations.

Across England, convention bureaus, professional conference organisers and universities collaborate to connect associations with leading experts and world-class infrastructure. In many English destinations, these local and national champions come together through **ambassador programmes**, working in partnership to secure conferences and build lasting relationships between cities and their key sectors. In other cities, established **networks** and **advocates** play a similar role, supporting destinations in attracting important business events. Collectively, the impact of these programmes and networks with academic and industry leaders extends far beyond individual events – they drive innovation, investment and growth across the wider economy.



Ambassador Success Story

Dr Vartul Sangal

Assistant Professor in Cellular and Molecular Sciences

Why did you feel it was important to bring Bergey's International Society for Microbial Systematics (BISMiS) to Newcastle?

Newcastle upon Tyne has been at the heart of innovation in prokaryotic systematics due to pioneering work of Prof Michael Goodfellow (1941–2024). He was one of the founders of BISMiS Society and established extensive international collaborations and mentored numerous PhD students who continue to advance his scientific vision. Therefore, hosting this conference in Newcastle would honour his legacy while bringing together the global community he helped to build.

How did working with the city convention bureau or destination team help in attracting or delivering the event?

This conference will be organised from 29 June – 2 July 2027 at Northumbria University, Newcastle upon Tyne. I believe that this event will be highly beneficial by developing new collaborations between UK researchers and global experts and will also contribute economically by supporting local businesses (catering and accommodation) and tourism (sightseeing activities). I continue to work with colleagues at Venues at Northumbria and NewcastleGateshead Convention Bureau to organise this event successfully.

What advice would you give to other potential ambassadors who might want to support bids in the future?

It has been a great experience thus far, both professionally and personally. This programme not only contributed to a successful bid for organising the conference in 2027 but also provided me with the opportunities to connect with experts in the field, making the effort worthwhile. Therefore, I would strongly encourage others to become ambassadors.

What are you most excited about for the future of your city as a hub for business events and knowledge exchange?

This event will build upon the excellence in microbiology and prokaryotic systematics at Northumbria and other North-East universities, making the city well-positioned to host such a specialised international conference that will drive knowledge exchange and foster research partnerships. Hopefully, the combination of strong academic institutions, competitive hosting costs, and excellent connectivity will attract more research-focused events to be organised in Newcastle upon Tyne in the future.

Can you tell us a bit about the ISSDP and its 2025 conference in Manchester?

The International Society for the Study of Drug Policy (ISSDP) is the largest global network of drug policy scholars, known for its strong research focus and interdisciplinary approach, spanning fields like criminology, sociology, public health, and economics, and utilising diverse methodologies. We're thrilled with the feedback from the conference; delegates truly felt the "Mancunian welcome" we aimed for. As the 18th edition of the ISSDP conference, it was wonderful for it to "come of age" in our city.

This year's theme was social justice, exploring everything from equitable access to treatment to drug policy reform and its socioeconomic impact. We covered subthemes like drug markets, harm reduction, and methodological innovation. We specifically aimed to encourage researchers from underrepresented countries, and it was fantastic to see strong representation from Latin America. A key goal was also to provide a platform for early career researchers and to foster knowledge exchange and networking beyond academia, connecting with practitioners, policymakers, and journalists. We believe we delivered on ISSDP's reputation for inspiring and cutting-edge discussions.

What benefits did hosting the ISSDP Conference bring to you personally, your research group, the university, and the wider academic community?

The conference has put DPSC, Man Met and the city on the map for a global network of drug policy scholars. I think it was a great opportunity to showcase our research, make new connections and invite collaborations. Plus, it gave local practitioners and those with lived and living experience to participate in knowledge exchange. Man Met is a university that champions research with impact and DPSC strives to ensure our research findings reaches the public and community audience.

What does being an "Mbassador" for Manchester mean to you, and what would be your key message to others considering bidding to host events in Manchester?

I am so proud to call Manchester my home and I have enjoyed the opportunity to reconnect with the city and show delegates around. I have wanted to host the ISSDP conference for a few years, but I was hesitant due to the amount of work it would take alongside my already busy schedule. But, when Anthony got in touch with me and told me about the support that we would get from the Manchester Convention Bureau and its partners, that finally gave me the push to go for it.

Ambassador Success Story

How has working with Marketing Sheffield and its ambassador programme helped you attract major events and create long-term impact? Working with Marketing Sheffield has been instrumental in bringing major national and international child health events to the city - most notably the UK's, and very likely the world's first, Child Health Technology Conference (CHT). Starting with CHT2021 and now running annually, their support was central to securing Sheffield as the host city for this pioneering event, which has now welcomed 171 speakers and 607 delegates from 33 countries, each showcasing the most advanced and impactful research in child health technology. The conference has rapidly become a global focal point for innovation in paediatric health, and Sheffield's role as host has positioned the city at the forefront of this emerging field.

Our collaboration with Marketing Sheffield extends far beyond a single event. Together, we are working to deliver a world first: the 42,000 sq ft National Centre for Child Health Technology (NCCHT). This landmark development will bring together industry partners, universities, healthcare professionals, and critically, children and young people themselves. The centre will serve as a hub for co design, research, and innovation, accelerating the development of technologies that improve the health and healthcare of children and young people. Marketing Sheffield has played a key role in shaping the narrative, strengthening the city's profile, and helping us articulate the global significance of this project.

What kind of legacy do you think these events have created? The legacy of these events is already visible. Locally, they have strengthened Sheffield's reputation as a centre of excellence for child health technology, attracting new partnerships, investment, and academic collaborations. Academically, they have helped cement the city's role as a convenor of global expertise, creating new research networks and opportunities for cross-disciplinary innovation. Within the wider industry, the conferences and the forthcoming NCCHT have signalled that Sheffield is not only a host city but a leader, shaping the future of child health technology and influencing national and international agendas.

What advice would you give to other potential ambassadors who might want to support bids in the future? For future ambassadors considering supporting bids, my advice is simple: embrace the partnership fully. Marketing Sheffield brings expertise, networks, and a deep understanding of how to position the city effectively. Work collaboratively, be open to their guidance, and involve them early in the process. Their ability to connect you with venues, suppliers, civic partners, and promotional channels is invaluable. Most importantly, remember that being an ambassador is not just about securing an event, it is about showcasing Sheffield's strengths, building long-term relationships, and creating opportunities that leave a lasting impact on the city and your field.

These conferences have generated significant economic impact, strengthened Cambridge's international profile and fostered long-term collaboration between local and global partners. Why did you feel it was important to bring the Wild Summit 2025 to Bristol?

We worked hard to encourage the conference to come to Bristol! It was the first time a major national summit of this type was being created for the nature sector, and we knew that it would allow the extensive and long-standing environmental work in the city to be showcased on a national stage. It also felt exciting, topical and important - we just really wanted to be involved! We were able to forge a connection and partnership with the organisers (who were originally considering another location) and work closely with them as delivery partners. We knew - and were right - that the event would bring national politicians, national organisations and national broadsheet coverage to the region alongside forging connections between a huge variety of organisations.

What was the highlight or proudest moment of hosting the event in your city?

Can I pick two? First, we were able to use the event to support policy development work in the city, and the region's Mayor hosted a breakfast to kick off the event alongside releasing a press notice that outlined current and future commitment for nature to support the region's growth. The business breakfast was absolutely packed and led straight into the rest of the conference - which was completely sold out! The second was bringing in 10% of the audience from local communities, under-represented groups and small charities through a bursary scheme and subsidised ticket policy.

How did the conference benefit your field, your institution, or your wider professional community?

It was critical to bring the nature sector together in 2025 - the theme of the conference was 30 x 30 (our nation's targets to safeguard 30% of our land and sea for nature by 2030). The conference brought experts, communities, conservation experts, researchers and campaigners together to take stock - what needed to happen in the next 5 years to meet our ambition? As local delivery partners, we were able to super-charge our professional networks and also build our own capacity for supporting larger events.

How did working with the city convention bureau or destination team help in attracting or delivering the event?

The services provided by Meet Bristol & Bath and VisitWest are incredibly important for a small charity such as ours. We are in touch with them multiple times throughout the year for advice, venue-finding, and promotion of our activity.

Ambassador Success Story

Fabrizio Salvatore

Professor of Physics

What inspired you to become involved as an ambassador for Brighton?

Since I joined the University of Sussex in 2009, I wanted to make everything I could to put the University and the city of Brighton on the 'map' of the important scientific events in my field (Particle Physics). For this reason, whenever possible I have put forward Brighton and the University of Sussex for several international particle physics conferences/ workshops, with notable success.

How do you think the ambassador programme helps strengthen connections between local experts and the global community?

Sharing experiences (and expertise) is crucial for the good organisation of an event. Having a community of ambassadors would be extremely useful in identifying the right venue for the right amount of people, the best possible accommodation considering different necessities (low budget for PhD students, higher end accommodation for distinguished guests, etc), restaurants that cater for various dietary requirements, etc.

How did you first get involved in supporting event bids?

I have organised several national and international events, with participants ranging from 30 to 250. As an active member of the ATLAS Experiment at CERN, I have organised both international workshops to bring together the experiment's community, as well as international conferences on the topic of particle physics. I am currently in the International Organisation Committee of a large bi-annual particle physics detector conference (the CALOR conference series), and I was successful in bringing the conference to Brighton in May 2022.

What are you most excited about for the future of your city as a hub for business events and knowledge exchange?

There is a lot to do in the city, and loads is being done to improve the city as a whole, with several big improvement works ongoing (from improving the seafront, to improving the traffic in the city centre). Bringing large events (especially international ones) would be crucial to keep improving the city also for those who live in Brighton.


