
Summary of Results

- When comparing April 2023 results with April 2022, **room occupancy** increased from 73% to 77%, now slightly above pre-pandemic levels, (April 2019 was 76%).
- Room supply increased 0.3% and room demand increased 6.6% compared to April 2022.
- **RevPAR**, which is the total room revenue divided by the total number of available rooms, increased by 24% to £90.52 in April 2023, when compared to the same month in 2022.
- Looking at hotel performance across **destination types**, occupancy in city / large towns increased the most, from 73% to 78%, followed by small town occupancy which increased from 72% to 75%, and then seaside and countryside occupancy both increased 2% compared to April 2022.
- Assessing room occupancy by establishment size, the largest hotel rooms (100+ rooms) increased their occupancy the most, up 9% to 77% in April 2023. Hotels with 51-100 rooms increased their occupancy 1% to 79% and 26-50 room establishments increased +1% to 74%. The smallest hotels with under 25 rooms saw their occupancy drop 3% to 70% compared to last year.
- Most **regions** saw positive growth in April 2023, with London occupancy up 11% to 80%, now just shy of 2019 figures. The South East saw the next biggest year on year growth, up 8% to 77% followed by the South West, +5% to 76%.




England Room Occupancy









Methodology Statement

In July 2017, a change of suppliers was made to the occupancy data. The data is now collected via a syndicated panel of over 3,000 hotels and other accommodation businesses provided by hotel market data and benchmarking company - STR.

STR collects the following performance metrics from participating properties either on a daily or monthly basis through their online platform or data feeds:

- Number of rooms available
- - Number of rooms sold
- - Total room revenue

These baseline figures are used to calculate the three most relevant metrics within the accommodation industry namely: Occupancy, Average Daily Rate (ADR) and Revenue Per Available Room (RevPAR). All units given throughout this report represent a positive number, unless stated otherwise.

To allow a meaningful comparison of year-on-year trends, VisitEngland and STR have included historical data from STR's own participating properties in the reports from July 2017 onwards. The historical data displayed in these reports is not consistent with reports published prior to the July 2017 report. Further details about STR's panel and data collection can be found in our methodology note. All previous months' reports and data can be found on the VisitEngland website.

In February 2019, a change in reporting style was made to refer to percentage changes of occupancy data in absolute terms. Please note that the room occupancy figures in this report are rounded to the nearest whole number. As a result, occupancy absolute percentage change figures may have a discrepancy of ±1%. All previous reports prior to February 2019 show percentage changes of occupancy data in relative terms. ADR, RevPAR, Supply & Demand percentage change changes continue to be shown in relative terms.

Due to Covid-19, the England hotel industry saw an unprecedented number of hotels temporarily close their doors starting in March of 2020. Throughout the pandemic, STR has continued to collect performance data from those hotels who remained open.

The data in this month's report is based on those hotels that were open and reported data to STR (N=3,521)
